#### **WOMEN MINISTERS BEFORE 1977**

#### Introduction

This article is an attempt to provide a definitive listing of women ordained as Ministers of the Word prior to the formation of the Uniting Church. The period examined is 1927 - 1977. A few details have still not been confirmed, but it was thought that it would be helpful to publish this list at this stage noting that it is seventy years since the first women was ordained. Readers are invited to submit new information to the editor which may alter the final number of ordinations, but the most likely number of women ordained prior to union is 35, being made up of Congregationalists (13), Methodist (14) and Presbyterian (8). Three died and two left their church before Church union. Only one of those ministers alive at the time of union declined to enter the Uniting Church. Six more have died since union and one has left the church. Of the remaining 22, one half are in settlements, nine are retired and two are not in settlements.

# Congregational Churches

Congregationalists were the first religious body to ordain women as ministers in Australia, with the first person being the well-known figure Winifred Kiek, just over 50 years before church union. Ordinations were conducted within the local church or congregation under the oversight of the Congregational Union of Australia and four states ordained women: New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia and Victoria. At least thirteen women were ordained in Australia, (see note below). Several Congregational women who had been ordained outside Australia also

ministered in Australia or worked as missionaries in the Pacific. The number ordained is about the same as the Methodists who started ordaining women some forty years later, but this mainly reflects their respective numerical starting points.

#### The Methodist Church of Australasia

#### Background

The Methodist Church General Conference held in May 1966 resolved to proceed with the ordination of women by a formal vote: 132 for - 18 against. This decision was confirmed at the 1968 General Conference and the avenue for the ordination of women was open. Many of the early ministerial candidates came from the deaconess order. All candidates were ordained at the annual state conference usually held in October. Margaret Sanders was the first woman to be ordained by the Methodist Church, at a service held on Sunday 19th October 1969 (by the Methodist Conference in WA). The Victorian conference ordained 10 of the 14 women ordained by the Methodist Church, with Coralie Ling's ordination coming just a few days after Margaret Sanders. No women were ordained as Methodists in NSW, the Northern Territory or in Tasmania (through the joint conference), though the first person to be ordained in the Uniting Church in NSW was ex-Methodist Janet Wade (now Wade-Main) on the 18 September 1977.

# The Presbyterian Church of Australia

# Background

The Presbyterian Church approved the possible ordination of women to the office of elder in 1967. The next step was to consider the ordination of women as ministers of the Word and Sacraments. The move to ordain women ministers in the Presbyterian Church arose from the presentation of a final (and third) report by the Reverend Alan Smart (appointed in 1967) to the General Assembly of the

Presbyterian Church in Australia in 1970. The recommendations included the plain statement "that women should be eligible for ordination to the Ministry of Word and Sacraments". Following Presbyterian polity, the report was commended to state assemblies and presbyteries for consideration and brought back to the 1974 General Assembly, where the Assembly declared that "women shall be eligible for admission to the Ministry of Word and Sacraments in the Presbyterian Church of Australia on the same terms and conditions as are applicable to men." (See Arthur Patrick reference below). After the Assembly the applications of three women (Marlene Thalheimer, Alison Grant and Geraldine Wheeler) were processed, and with all academic requirements met, exit certificates were issued in July 1974. Marlene Thalheimer and Geraldine Wheeler were licensed to preach in August, with Marlene Thalheimer being the first woman to be ordained by the Presbyterian Church in Australia, in Victoria in October 1974. Geraldine Wheeler went overseas for eighteen months and was ordained on return in Queensland. Seven of the eight ordained - Queensland (3), Victoria (3) and South Australia (1) - entered the Uniting Church.
